


Horizons' mission is straightforward – to instill hope, strengthen communities, and brighten futures by providing life changing services to underserved populations.

We have three specific focus areas: nutrition access, transportation equity, and financial literacy and empowerment. We continue to work diligently to address the challenges and barriers that impact those most in need in our community. We have recently added AniMeals, often referred to as 'Meals on Wheels for pets', assisting individuals to keep and feed their important furry friends.

While our community needs continue to increase and our statistics are strong, our organization is all about people, period. We serve our clients and eastern lowa communities, meeting all clients wherever they are in life, always treated with dignity and respect. We nurture the soul, affirm our commitment to holistic well-being, and work to improve social isolation.


