State Scholarships

27,148 awards made

for over \$62.1 million

There are several types of state scholarships, these scholarships are appropriated by the State of Iowa. The students are not required to pay this money back.

Federal Pell Grant

226,156 awards made

for over \$849.6 million

Federal Pell Grants are based on financial need and do not have to be paid back.

Federal SEOG

23,418 awards made

for over \$15.7 million

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) is for undergraduates with exceptional financial need.



Federal Direct Loans

556,863 awards made

for over \$2.48 billion

Federal Direct Loans are lowinterest loans for eligible students. By contacting the Financial Aid Offices at participating schools, eligible students can access loans offered directly through the U.S. Department of Education.

Perkins Loans

14,418 awards made

for over \$26.7 million

Federal Perkins Loans are lowinterest loans for both undergraduate and graduate students with financial need.



Institutional Scholarships

555,343 awards made

for over \$622.6 million

Institutional Scholarships are given based on financial need and/or academic success. The students are not required to pay this money back.

Institutional CWS

36,447 awards made

for over \$163.4 million

Institutional College Work Study (CWS) provides part-time jobs for students on campus around the state.

Federal CWS

9,292 awards made

for over \$15.8 million

Federal College Work Study (CWS) provides part-time jobs for students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay for education expenses.
